




PRÉFACE

This 1984 edition involves a great reduction in the number of items: synonyms and subgenera are omitted.

The number of pronunciation symbols has been reduced. Let the linguists argue whether the a in add is significantly different from the a in care, or whether the u in cube is worth distinguishing from the u in unite, merely because of accent.

In spite of the difference in appearance we have made few changes in pronunciation.

The pronunciations of the names of taxa are anglicized in spoken English; hence they cannot be used in other languages. The derivations, however, will be useful in any language.

A note on grammar:--The name of a genus is treated as a Latin noun in the nominative singular. It cannot, therefore, have a plural. If one wished to refer to all the species of *Myrmecocystus*, it would be incorrect to use "the *Myrmecocysti*;" one would have to say "all the species of *Myrmecocystus*." The names of taxa above the genus are treated as Latin nouns in the plural.
